Long Term Housing Agreement Update from Superintendent Stout

Dear Rocklin Academy Meyers and Turnstone Families and Staff:

I hope your summer is off to a good start! Several weeks ago, I sent communication regarding the future plans for the physical location of our Meyers and Turnstone schools. In that letter, I described how the initial Long Term Housing Agreement (LTHA) with Rocklin Unified School District (RUSD) is set to expire after being in place for eleven years and how the needs of our schools have evolved, requiring a new facilities plan for the foreseeable future.

The plan under which we currently operate was agreed to through negotiations with RUSD and our hope is that we can come to another mutually beneficial agreement. In the meantime, I wanted to provide you with information in response to some of the questions we have received.

Will anything change for the upcoming 2018-2019 school year?

No. The coming school year is the final year of the current agreement so both schools will operate as they have in the past.

Is maintaining the status quo an option for a new agreement?

No. Maintaining the two schools as they are does not provide the best environment in which to implement our educational model nor is it cost-effective. We need an agreement that allows us to maximize educational benefit and dedicate our resources to the classroom.

What are Rocklin Academy's goals for the LTHA?

We want to provide the best educational environment for our students, maximize collaboration opportunities for teachers, and have a plan which is fiscally responsible. Having three classes per grade level would increase teachers' ability to differentiate and group students. For instance, teachers can use student data to identify students' needs on particular skills or standards, and can group their students across the three classrooms, targeting instruction for students across the grade level. One teacher can provide intervention for students, another for students needing instruction and practice, and the third provide an extension for students who have already mastered the skill. The additional collaboration time for teachers being on one campus would directly impact the educational benefit for our students.

To achieve this, our best case scenario would be to combine our Turnstone and Meyers students and families on one campus. Ideally, the campus would be our own site, not a shared

campus with another school.

Is there a chance the schools could close without a new housing agreement?

No. The housing agreement is separate from the charters that authorize the schools.

What happens if a negotiated agreement can't be reached?

State law, passed by voters in 2000, requires school districts to provide facilities to charter schools that are "reasonably equivalent" to those provided to district-run schools if requested by the charter school. This is commonly referred to as a "Prop 39" request, named for the proposition number that voters passed. Prop 39 proceedings can be complicated and take several months to reach conclusion. Therefore, if we are unable to reach an agreement soon, we will very likely make a Prop 39 request to RUSD.

Is there anything parents can do now to help?

At this point, I just wanted to make sure you were up to date on our progress. There is not anything for parents to do right now; however, there will likely be opportunities for engagement should we move into the Prop 39 process.

Thank you for letting me interrupt your summer to give you this update, and please let me know if you have any questions.

New Rocklin Academy Driving Policy

Our student transportation policy was updated this past year to include requiring a DMV driving record in order to drive on field trips of a certain length. As this change was made mid-year, it was only implemented for field trips in which traveling 65 miles or more was involved.

Student safety is our number one priority. As such, the requirement to obtain and submit a DMV driving record has been extended to all chaperones who wish to drive on any field trip regardless of distance (when transporting children other than your own).
